

## **Idols of the Heart**

How anything can take the place of Christ

Christ alone should occupy the throne of our heart.



All desires should be submitted under the Lordship of Christ. There are good desires, like Jesus' desire for his disciples to pray with him, but they fall asleep. But something becomes an idol, even if it is a "good thing" if it overtakes our heart. What should we do if this happens?



## 1. Recognize / Repent

"D" is the desire that has turned into a demand of entitlement. That's a demand that needs to be nipped in the bud as soon as it sprouts.

**2. Refocus** on God: singularity. There is one answer. Refocus on God, his presence and promises.

**3. Replace** with prayer, self-control, patience, godly conflict resolution skills, godly character.
